Many games and apps have an age limit and children and parents need to make sure this is followed e.g. Facebook, Whatsapp, Snapchat etc.

5. How do you feel about COVID. Do children feel safe?

Discussed that children across school have caught the virus. Also shared that children are relatively unaffected by COVID. Agreed that many children are carrying out a LFT on a regular basis. We need to make sure we continue to be sensible.

Many children have shared they feel safe at school in the past two years. No one wants to go back to Remote Learning.

One class shared that some children's behaviour is poor at lunchtime. This does get sorted by an adult but sometimes it does not as some children are not reporting this to an adult.

Action:
