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Glossary of terms

Fred Talk: Fred is a puppet who can only say and read words in **pure sounds**; he cannot say the whole word. He never adds 'uh' after a consonant sound e.g. fuh, luh, muh. (A slight 'uh' cannot be helped when saying the sounds b, d, g, j, w and y)

Grapheme: one letter or one group of letters used to write one sound e.g.
The sound 'f' can be written with the grapheme f (fun) ff (huff) ph (photo)
The sound 'igh' can be written with the grapheme igh (night) or i (kind) or ie (tie)

Green words: Words made up of the graphemes listed in the sound boxes on page 4

Red words: Common words with a grapheme not listed in the sound boxes

Challenge words: Topical words particular to this story

Syllables: Chunks within long words

Root: The part of the word that gives the most meaning

How to use this book

Follow the advice, in italics, given for you on each page.

Support the children as they read the text that is shaded in cream.

Praise the children at every step!

What's your favourite type of party?

What do you have to get ready if you are having a party?

Where do you go shopping for party things?

In this story, it's Jade's birthday and she's very excited. She goes with her big brother, Dave, to the shops with a shopping list. They have fun loading the trolley and choosing napkins and balloons. But, when they get home and unpack... something has gone horribly wrong...

Dave picked up twenty rolls and put them in the trolley.

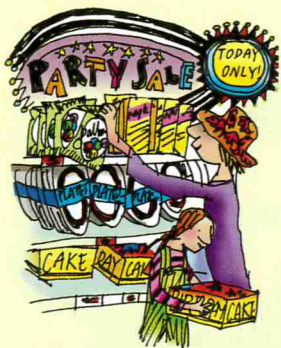
(I picked up a currant bun, and hid it under the rolls.)

Plastic bags all look the same to me. I'll take the blame, Dad.

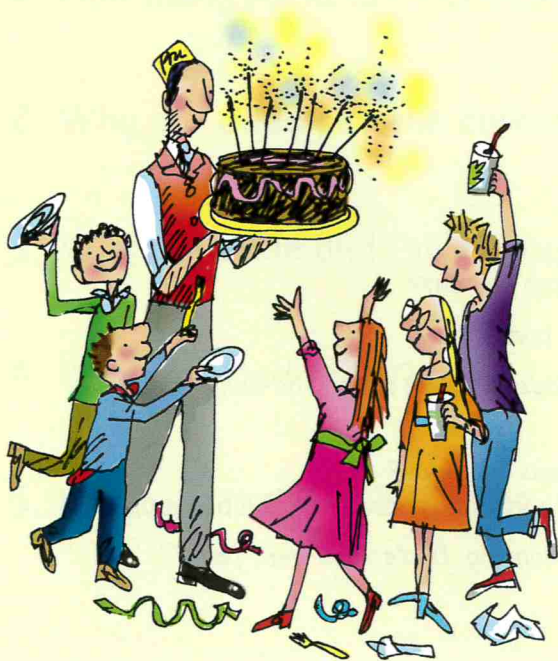
I'll take it all back to the shops on Monday."

5. Why was it OK at the end?
