

Children with health needs who cannot attend school policy

Broad Heath Primary School



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1. Aims

This policy aims to ensure that:

- › Suitable education is arranged for pupils on roll who cannot attend school due to health needs
- › Pupils, staff and parents understand what Broad Heath is responsible for when this education is being provided by the local authority

2. Legislation and guidance

This policy reflects the requirements of the [Education Act 1996](#).

It also based on guidance provided by our local authority.

3. The responsibilities of Broad Heath

3.1 If Broad Heath makes arrangements

Initially, Broad Heath will attempt to make arrangements to deliver suitable education for children with health needs who cannot attend school.

The pastoral team will make contact with the parents and alongside the class teacher, will monitor any arrangements made. Arrangements may include work packs, online resources, challenges and hospital school work. These arrangements will be communicated with parents using a range of communication tools such as video conferencing, phone call and email. We will work with parents and Broad Heath SENCo to reintegrate pupils back into school.

3.2 If the local authority makes arrangements

If Broad Heath can't make suitable arrangements, Coventry LA will become responsible for arranging suitable education for these children.

In cases where the local authority makes arrangements, Broad Heath will:

- › Work constructively with the local authority, providers, relevant agencies and parents to ensure the best outcomes for the pupil
- › Share information with the local authority and relevant health services as required
- › Help make sure that the provision offered to the pupil is as effective as possible and that the child can be reintegrated back into school successfully
- › When reintegration is anticipated, work with the local authority to:
 - Plan for consistent provision during and after the period of education outside Broad Heath, allowing the pupil to access the same curriculum and materials that they would have used in school as far as possible
 - Enable the pupil to stay in touch with school life (e.g. through newsletters, emails, invitations to school events or internet links to lessons from their school)

- Create individually tailored reintegration plans for each child returning to school
- Consider whether any reasonable adjustments need to be made

4. Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed annually by the Deputy Headteacher. At every review, it will be approved by the full governing board.
