Ensure the map is detailed and labelled with the names of the different regions.</p>	<p><u>Art</u> To research <u>Ancient Greek pottery</u>. What can you find out about it? Then, recreate your own Ancient Greek pot using materials at home.</p>	<p><u>Science</u> To explain how <u>bridges are built to defy the effects of Gravity</u>. <u>Challenge-</u> prove which other forces need to be considered to create a successful bridge?</p>	<p><u>History</u> To research the <u>Olympic games</u>. How did the Olympic Games begin? Who started them? Interesting facts? Create a fact file.</p>	<p><u>Model Competition</u> To research the <u>features of an Ancient Greek stadium and build one</u>. Make a model of the Ancient Greek stadium where the Olympic Games were held. The most detailed and accurate models will be showcased.</p>
