### Absence and Attendance

- If your child is not well enough to attend school, you must phone the school office on 02476 689558 in the morning for each day of their absence from 7.30am.
   Please make sure you call before 8.30am.
- Attendance is very important at school as the children are learning new concepts every day.
- If your child has been prescribed antibiotics or medication that they will need to take at school, please hand these into the school office to be stored securely a form needs to be completed by the parent for authorisation of medicine.



### Classes and Class Sizes

- Class Sizes: There are 3 Reception classes with 30 children in each Reception class. They are called Reception Red, Reception White and Reception Blue. Each class has a teacher and teaching assistant.
- The school also has a 52 place Nursery which runs as a morning and an afternoon session.
- Although the children are in three classes, Reception still runs very much as a unit with adjoining doors and a communal outdoor area. The outdoor area also connects with our Nursery and the children have opportunities to mix with each other.




# Early Years Curriculum

- Activities in both Nursery and Reception are carefully planned and organised in order to provide a
  range of learning experiences. In Reception children have learning books and in Nursery Learning
  Journals are kept by staff to record the activities your child participates in and undertakes, as well
  as their progress in specific skills.
- Planning for each term is carried out using a topic-based approach, following the children's interests and responding to specific events.
- There are 7 Areas of Learning in the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS), which activities are planned around:
- · Communication and Language
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Physical Development
- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design
- Throughout the EYFS, children will be working towards the Early Learning Goals. These describe the level of attainment expected at the end of your child's Reception year in school.

# On Your Child's First Day

- There are two main entrances to the school from which children enter the school site (Webster Park and St Paul's Road).
- You should bring your child into school via one of these entrances and to the main doors of your child's classroom between 8:30am and 8:59am. Registers close at 9.00am.
- If you arrive after this time please take your child straight to the school office.
- In Nursery you will be asked to leave the children with staff, if they are settled. If your child finds it difficult and becomes upset, we will liaise with you.



# Collection from School

- At the end of the day, the children are seen out of the classroom doors and we ask you to wait by the fence near the classrooms. It is useful if you stand in a similar position each day as this can help staff know where to look for you to ensure your child comes out safely.
- If someone other than a parent is collecting, please ensure you inform the office as soon as possible they will ask you for a password which the individual collecting will have to share with the adult dismissing. We are not allowed to release the children unless we have your permission. If someone else will be collecting regularly, a letter stating the days at the start of term will be sufficient.
- Please remember that it is very important to us to see the children out safely and it can take a little while at the beginning while we are getting to know the parents. We appreciate your patience during this time.



### School Dinners & Snacks

- Lunch: All Early Years and Key Stage 1 children are entitled to a free school meal each day. There will be a selection of different meals available each day for your child to choose from. Vegetarian options are always available. Please let us know if your child has any other dietary restrictions or requirements. Members of staff will be present during lunchtimes if any support is required.
- **Snacks:** Children will be able to have fruit during the day which they are able to access independently as part of the classroom provision.
- **Drinks:** Water and milk is available throughout the day in Nursery. In Reception children are provided with their own named water bottle. Milk is also provided as part the class provision.



### Health

- Health: Staff need to be aware of your child's medical background, any allergies (e.g. bee stings, dairy food), any dietary restrictions (e.g. vegetarian or Halal) and any medical conditions that are important for us to know (e.g. asthma or eczema).
- Children can suddenly become ill and therefore it is important that we know we can contact you or another adult, relative/friend at any time. Please ensure that the school is kept up to date with your contact details. If your child is unable to attend school due to illness, please telephone the school office to let us know.


# Home Learning

- We understand and value the support you provide for your child at home.
   Early years staff would love to hear about what you and your child have been achievements and experiences with staff, as this helps us to build a more complete picture of your child.
- **Homework:** All children will be issued with a homework book and given one maths and one literacy piece of homework each week to complete.
- **Reading book** Your child will be issued with a reading book. The book will be changed twice a week depending on their understanding and fluency. Please read with your child and comment in their reading record. Your child will need to bring their reading books into school everyday.
- Stay and Play- Stay and Play sessions take place on a Friday from 2.15pm 3.00pm. This is an opportunity where you can complete activities with your child and see their learning journey.



# Phonics & Writing

- We have a phonics lesson every day at school. This is differentiated according to the children's needs and abilities.




# Home Learning - Blogs

### We Will Gain

In preparation for **Reception**, we would like your child to do the following:

### Literacy

### **Reading:**

- Support your child to recognise and read their name.
- Enjoy reading stories with your child and listen to different Nursery Rhymes.
- Recognise 10 initial sounds.

### Writing:

- Hold a pencil to draw and attempt to draw a picture Encourage talk about what they have drawn.
- Support your child to learn to write their name.
- Beginning to form some recognisable letters Use chalk, paint, pencils, and pencil crayons to practise formation.

### **Mathematics**

### Number:

- Recite and count to 10 (or beyond to 20).
- Count objects, actions and sounds 1 5 or 1 10.
- Recognise numbers to 10.
- Sing a range of different number rhymes and songs.: 10 Speckled Frogs or 5 Little Ducks etc.

### Shape and Pattern:

- Recognise and name 4 basic shapes.
- Help your child to recognise and name shapes in the environment around them.
- To create patterns using different objects.
- Identify different colours.

### **Physical Development**

- To encourage your child to dress themselves including putting on shoes and doing them up.
- Ensure your child can put on their coat and do the zip or buttons up by themselves.
- Support and encourage your child to use a knife and fork when eating their food.



### **Personal Social and Emotional Development**

### Group work:

• Play a game with members of your family and learn to take turns.

### Independence:

 Support your child to go to the toilet by themselves and be able to wash their hands without any support.

### **Concentration:**

 Play memory games like 'Matching Pairs' with people in your house to develop concentration skills.

### Communication skills:

Look through a book with your child and encourage them to talk about what is happening
in the pictures. Support your child to talk about their ideas, needs and feelings.

### Wellbeing:

- Encourage your child to eat a variety of healthy fruit and vegetables.
- Identify foods which are healthy for you to eat and those that are not so healthy.

### **Be Creative**

- Draw a picture of you and your family.
- Create a card about yourself using pictures to tell your new teacher your likes and dislikes.
- Make a rainbow using different art media and identify the colours.


