Agenda / Minutes:

1. How have the children settled since we returned to school in January 2023?

- Enjoyed the Assessment week because we recapped previous learning and all children agreed to this.
- Everyone was on task with their learning during this week.
- Y6 children like their new maths groups
- It was good to see everyone after the Christmas holiday and share stories.
- Behaviour is continually good.
- Sad to hear that Mrs Frankish is leaving.

2. Review class teacher bricks. How effective are these bricks? Do you know how to earn these?

- Some children feel bricks are not being handed out fairly as some teachers are more generous than others.
- **Action:** Could there be a PE brick?
- On a whole, children agree the brick system is used fairly and promotes strong behaviour in and out of the classroom.
- Some bricks such as the corridor brick is not handed out as much as the others.

Action: Ensure teachers are consistent whilst handing out bricks.

3. How often do you refer to the School Values in lessons? Do teachers link these to particular lessons and themes?

- Sometimes these are referred to lesson but mainly in PSHE lessons.
- Some children think we do not use these values in maths lessons.
- All children know the school values.
- The majority of classes have these placed on a display in their rooms but not all.
- Agreed that these values are not shared as often as they could be in lessons.

Actions: Teacher to refer to values where appropriate during lesson times.

4. Classes should be reading their class book every day. Has this improved?

- Year 5 classes seem to read their book most days
- Year 6 classes don't seem to read their book on a daily basis

Action: Ensure class books are read consistently

5. Are there any other concerns or worries about school?

Action: Could the Year 6 children change their classes for wet playtimes on a termly basis? (This will need to be reviewed by the staff and understand the benefits of doing this.

Many children in Year 6 are worried about their SATs in May.

Action: Teachers to ensure children are feeling ok about their SATs in May.
